4.1 Service Area Update

D. Whiteway, Chief Financial Officer, presented Committee with an update on the current and projected activities planned throughout the service area:

• Financial Management - Residents are invited to watch the livestream of budget deliberations taking place this week. Administration is preparing for year end and will be meeting with departments across the organization to discuss requirements

- and scheduling. The City's auditors are expected to be on site later this the month for interim field work.
- Taxation & Assessment Administration is wrapping up new assessments for next year and will be moving on to look at permits that have been taken out during the year.
- Procurement & Supply Chain Management The following competitive bids have recently been awarded: Food and Beverage Service Provider has been awarded to 14 Food Co., with hopes of being open before year end in the Ernie Radbourne Pavilion; Artistic Ice Carving has been awarded to ICE on Whyte Festival Society; and City Hall Sign Refurbishment has been awarded to Prairie Sign.
- Graphical & Information Technology Services November 20 is GIS day in North America. User desktops are being upgraded to the new Microsoft operating system, Windows 11.
